

Christmas Eve Gabled Mitts

A Luxury Fingerless Mitts Pattern by **Gina House**



Materials:

Yarn: 1 skein of Elsbeth Lavold Angora or (91-100 yds/50-60g of luxury worsted weight yarn)

Needles: US 7 dpns, (2) 24" circs or (1) 40" circ for Magic Loop

Notions: Cable needle, measuring tape, tapestry needle, 2 feet of waste yarn, scissors, stitch marker

Size: Woman's medium/Finished dimensions: 6.5 inches long, 2.75 inches wide

Gauge: 4.5 stitches to 1 inches in stockinette. *PLEASE TAKE THE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.* It is essential that you check so that your mitts will come out the size that you desire.

Abbreviations.

K = knit p = purl ssk = slip 2 stitches, as if to knit, separtely, knit through the back loop k2tog = knit two stitches together knitwise CO = cast on BO = bind off

Important Note:

*I was able to knit both mitts (following the exact instructions and to the exact gauge) using **only 1 skein** of the Angora yarn. But, I literally had only an inch of yarn leftover when I was finished. I would recommend buying 2 skeins, just in case you would like to knit the mitt a bit longer (either on thumb or finger area) or if your gauge is slightly off. *



Directions:

With US 7 needles (or correct size to get gauge), CO 36 stitches loosely, leaving a 3" tail. Making sure not to twist, carefully join in the round and mark with a stitch marker, if necessary. Arrange stitches evenly on your needles.

LEFT HAND:

Ribbed Cuff-

Round 1: P3, k4, p4, k4, p3, *(k2, p2)....*repeat over the last 18 stitches Rounds 2-4: repeat round 1

Cabled Hand-

Round 5: P3, k12, p3, k18 Rounds 6&7: repeat round 5

Round 8: P3, and then using cable needle, place 4 stitches on this needle and hold to the **BACK** of the work, knit the next 4 stitches, knit the 4 stitches from the cable needle and then knit the last 4 stitches, p3, k18.

Rounds 9-11: repeat round 5

Round 12: P3, k4, and then using cable needle, place 4 stitches on this needle and hold to the **FRONT** of the work, knit the next 4 stitches, p3, k18.

Rounds 13-15: repeat round 5 Rounds 16-23: repeat rounds 8-15 Rounds 24-31: repeat rounds 8-15 Rounds 32-35: repeat rounds 8-11

Round 36: P3, and then using cable needle, place 4 stitches on this needle and hold to the **FRONT** of the work, knit the next 4 stitches, knit the 4 stitches from the cable needle and then knit the last 4 stitches, p3, k11. Drop the main yarn and, using the waste yarn, use this to knit the next 7stitches. Place these 7 waste yarn stitches back on the left needle and knit them again using the main yarn.

Rounds 37-39: repeat round 5 Rounds 40-43: repeat rounds 1-4

Rounds 44: BO loosely in pattern, leaving a 3 inch tail.

RIGHT HAND:

(Copy all of the left hand instructions until you get to round 36.)

Round 36: P3, and then using cable needle, place 4 stitches on this needle and hold to the **BACK** of the work, knit the next 4 stitches, knit the 4 stitches from the cable needle and then knit the last 4 stitches, p3. Drop the main yarn and, using the waste yarn, use this to knit the next 7stitches. Place these 7 waste yarn stitches back on the left needle and knit them again using the main yarn. K11.

Follow rounds 37-44 for left hand.

THUMB: (for both hands)

With a needle, pick up 7 stitches from top of waste yarn. With another dpn, pick up 7 stitches from the bottom of the waste yarn, picking out the waste yarn as you go.

Round 1: Starting at the corner of one of the needles, pick up 2 stitches on the "bare" corner, knit across 7, pick up 2 more stitches on the opposite corner, knit across the last 7 stitches. Place a marker here to indicate the start of the round.

Round 2: Knit, and while also distributing the stitches evenly.

Round 3: k1, k2tog, k6, k1, k2tog, k6.

Rounds 4-7: *(k2, p2)...*repeat across round

Round 8: BO loosely in pattern, leaving a 3 inch tail.

Finishing:

Using the tapestry needle, carefully weave in all the ends. Try the mitts on and lightly block if necessary.
